MEMBER'S ARTICLE BY ALAN PICKERING



I create landscapes, streetscapes and marine paintings in an impressionistic representational style, and my mediums include Oils, Acrylics, Gouache, and Pen and Wash. I like to work from direct observation on plein air studies and larger pieces as studio works.

I started my art interest midlife after finishing some postgraduate studies at university, and when my family reached the teenage years, as I had spare time, and a body a bit worn out from sport. In 2007, I joined Melville Arts and started through the various programs that were on offer. This included art starters, watercolours, and acrylics.

In 2012, I began plein air painting and oils at the same time and took a liking to both. Since then I've continued with plein air painting and participate weekly with the Perth Plein Air painters group, and have attended numerous workshops with wellknown visiting artists, when possible. A highlight has been the opportunity to travel



to Europe on six occasions to see museums, scenery and paint. Other highlights include painting in annual festivals for plein air painting at Mandurah (Plein air Downunder) and Beverley (Plein air Beverley). Later this year I will be the artist-in-residence at Beverley Station Arts for the third time.

My formal education and early working life comprised periods as an engineer, an IT manager, and a management consultant. A lot of this work was analytical, and is still present in my art practice today, where I try to create paintings that not only capture the essence of a scene, but also a viewer's interest. I am also a keen student of art techniques and equipment, and I make paint boxes and equipment for plein air painters.

In 2022, I started teaching introduction to plein air with oils via Melville Arts to provide a pathway for new painters.

I now wish that I'd played less sport, and started my art journey earlier in life. The possibilities are endless. My advice to people curious about taking up art, is to not delay, just start
