Hello fellow art lovers,

From a young age I loved to draw, especially ladies in crinoline frocks surrounded by flowers! My favourite subjects were art, history and maths.My Dad was in the Royal Navy so we did a lot of travelling, and many different schools. Moving on......

In 1962 I was awarded a Scholarship, to attend Cardiff College of Art, Cardiff, South Wales, UK. This opened a whole new world for me in the 60's. 'Those were the days my friend, we thought they would never end'.

Life happened, I got married (we celebrated our 59th anniversary this year), raised our family in Africa and returned to Australia where I obtained a Bachelor of Arts in the late 80's, majoring in Printmaking. Honoured to have won several Awards over the years; my greatest joy was winning the Printmaking *Annual Print Media Award* at The Moore's Contemporary Art Gallery in 2009. The prize was a printing press which still occupies pride of place in my studio (and sometimes almost produces exactly what I am trying to do!).

An active member of *The Printmakers* Association of WA since the late 80's, and committee member for 30 years, delivering numerous workshops, organising and

coordinating exhibitions, and was honoured with Life Membership 3 years ago.

Becoming a member of the Alfred Cove Art Society approximately 30 years ago (....yes that long): Secretary for several of our Presidents with a couple of breaks, then recently, once more into the fray...with Jennifer Tunnacliffe, and then Celeste Hilmer.

THE JON MARTIN DEMONSTRATION

March 2023



We were delighted to have John P Martin for our first demonstration in 2023. John is a water colourist who comes from Tasmania, and, after years of being a tiler and working in confined spaces has found a love of painting almost anything plein air. He finds painting in the open brings more spontaneity and he has "learnt to see" again. For instance, by squinting, he can see that shadows are not always purple and have different temperatures.

He starts his paintings with a light sketch in 2B pencil. We had to guess what the drawing was and there were a few lurid suggestions! He then sprays the page with water. He brings more energy to his work by adding additional water and applying quick diagonal strokes; In fact, he suggests that more artists should try to paint a whole painting with a 3inch flat brush. Adding a bit of detail in the end to create harmony of tone, colour and temperature. A flick of paint here, a dash or a squiggle there, and he is ready for his darker tones; making sure that the darkest darks are next to the lightest lights. While still damp, but making sure the shine has gone, he goes back into his painting with even stronger colours and tones. still making his marks freely but not quite with wild abandon.

Terry guessed that, rather than being a voluptuous woman from Moulin Rouge or a nursing mother with pendulous breasts, it was, in fact, a crazy camel with bad teeth and possibly bad breath but he was happy to get a bottle of wine for his insights. As you can see from the photos, the camel came to life and exuded so much personality. The painting was

purchased on the spot but he has many others in the same vein and they can be viewed on his website **ipmartinart**



It was, without doubt, a stimulating and inspiring night, and John's enthusiasm for his subject matter was contagious. It was a good reminder, at least for me, to remain with the fun of art, as with many of us, the better we get, the tighter we become. He suggests that all painters spend a couple of hours a week doing experimental work, without a care of the paintings future and just be in the moment. Great therapy and advice indeed!
